Can you find all the colours of the rainbow in the leaves, berries and changing colours of Autumn?

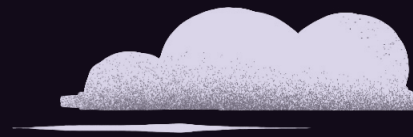


Look out for bracket fungus on tree stumps – or even in the street!

Go outside and shut your eyes. How does Autumn smell?



Get up and watch the sun rise – it's not too early now! In fact, can you watch the sun rise and set on the same day?



What shapes can you see in the clouds? Watch as the clouds move and change and make a story about what you see.



Get outside in the rain! Put on your coat and wellies and stomp in the puddles.



Having a bonfire? Don't forget to check first for hedgehogs trying to hibernate!



On a frosty morning, get outside with a magnifying glass and look at the ice really close up.



Look out for spiders' webs covered in beads of dew.

Look out for different kinds of nuts and seeds. Can you work out how they spread?



It's getting dark earlier—head out on a clear night and look at the moon and the stars. You could even take a night time trip out into Northumberland National Park and enjoy the dark skies.
