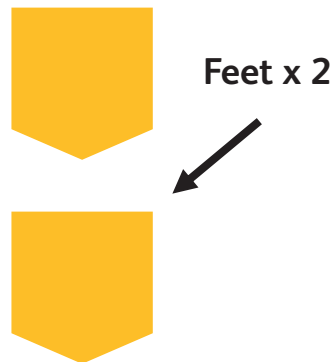
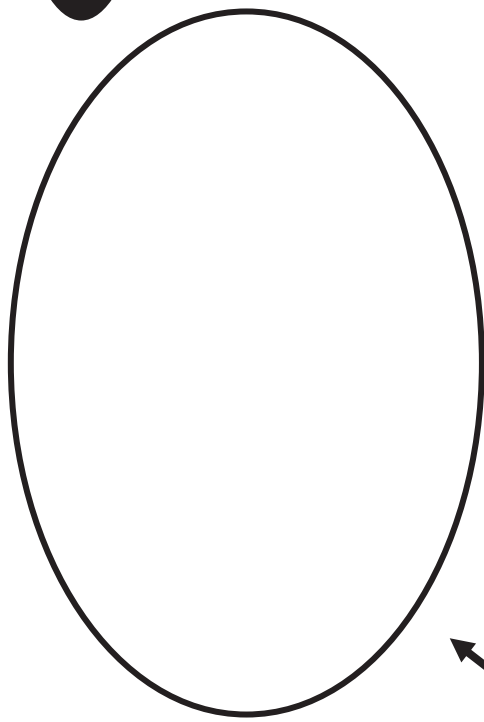
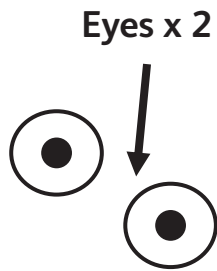
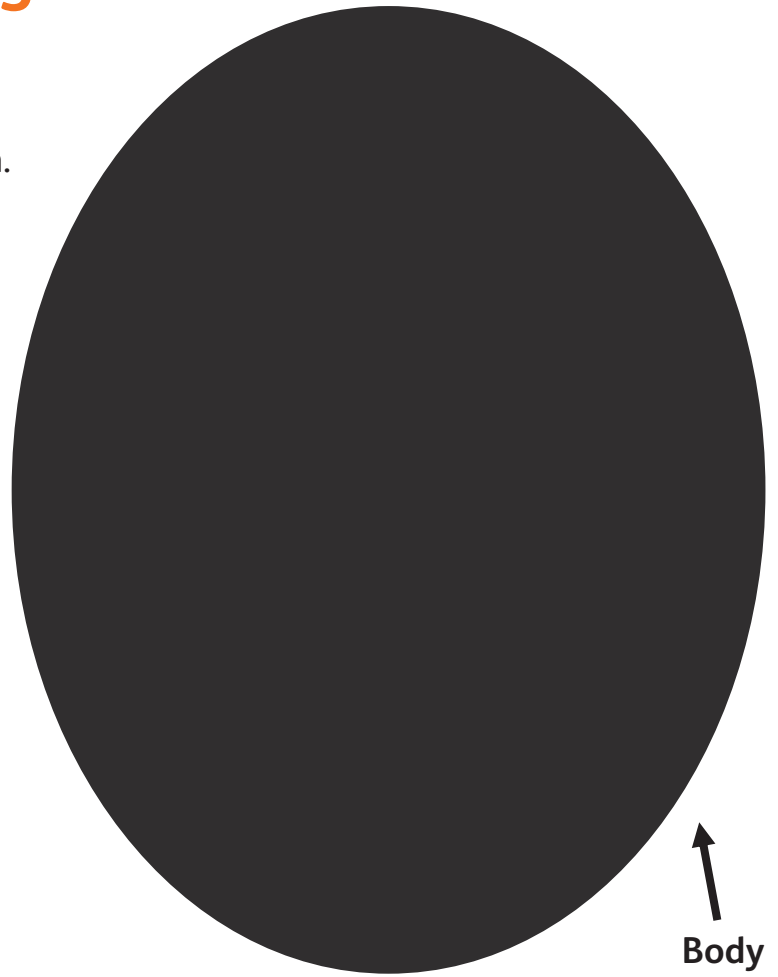


Make your own Penguin

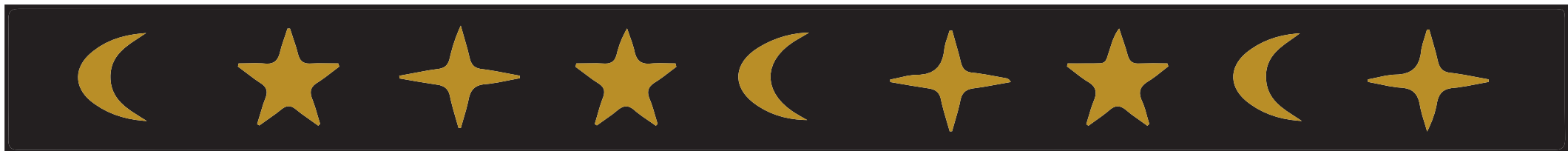

Make your own Polar Bear Headband
