








## GALLERY



Its cabinets gleam with North East silver, its glassware glitters, its works of art – among the finest in the world – inspire and impress and, among all these treasures, one shines particularly brightly.

The Laing Art Gallery can host wedding and civil partnership ceremonies in a variety of its rooms, including its dramatic 18th and 19th Century Gallery.

This richly decorated room houses works by world renowned artists including William Holman Hunt, Joshua Reynolds, Thomas Gainsborough and Gauguin, making it a fascinating and impressive wedding venue.

Discovery Museum is a glorious celebration of the spirit and skill that led Charles Parsons to invent the world's fastest steam ship, Turbinia, in 1894; that led Joseph Swan to invent the electric light bulb and that led thousands of ordinary men and women to make this region the epicentre of shipbuilding and engineering.

This magnificent Victorian building is filled to its soaring rafters with the achievements of the people of Tyneside – so fill it with your people; your friends and your families for a wedding with wow factor.



The first sight to greet guests as they enter our open, spacious foyer is Turbinia herself. They can dine alongside this pioneering 35m long vessel or gather here for drinks before moving on to the museum's Great Hall - itself a tribute to Victorian wealth and innovation.
